## Examination

On completion of the course there is a written five-hour exam. The maximum number of points that can be obtained is 100 ( 90 for grade A, 75 for $B, 60$ for $C, 50$ for $D$ and 45 for E ).

The course features a voluntary seminar series comprising 5 seminars.
A passing grade on the seminar series gives a 10 -point credit on the final exam. This means that you start the final exam with 10 points and will have to answer only four questions. Those without credit have to answer an additional question which can yield up to 10 points.

Each seminar is dedicated to a specific problem set. The analytical tasks specified within each problem set should be solved in groups comprising 3-4 students. Written solutions should be submitted group-wise to the seminar teacher no later than 12.00 (noon) the day before the seminar.

Answers must be provided to all seminars. Physical participation is required at four of the five seminars.
