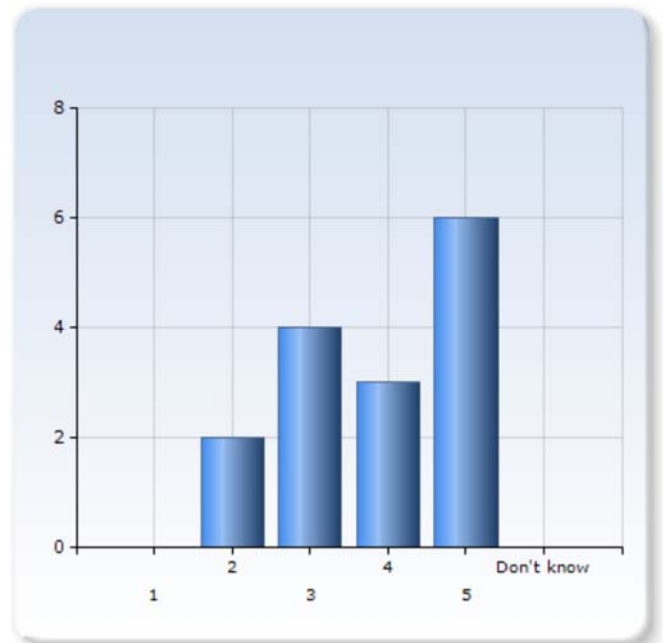

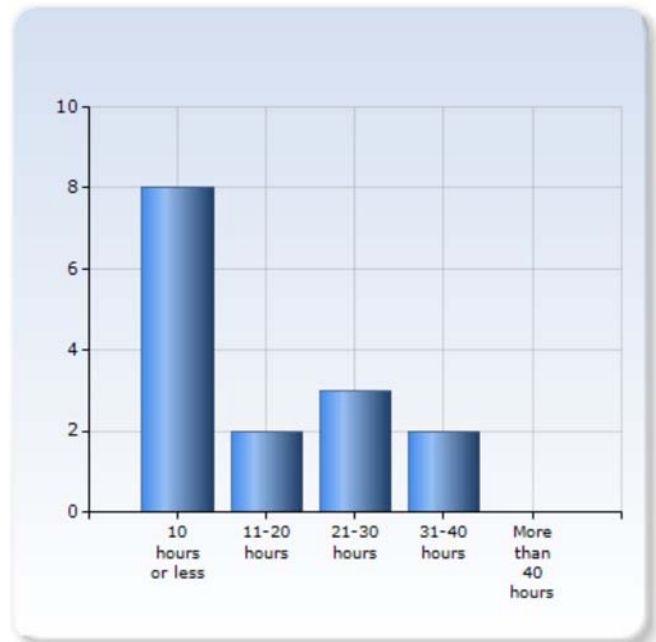

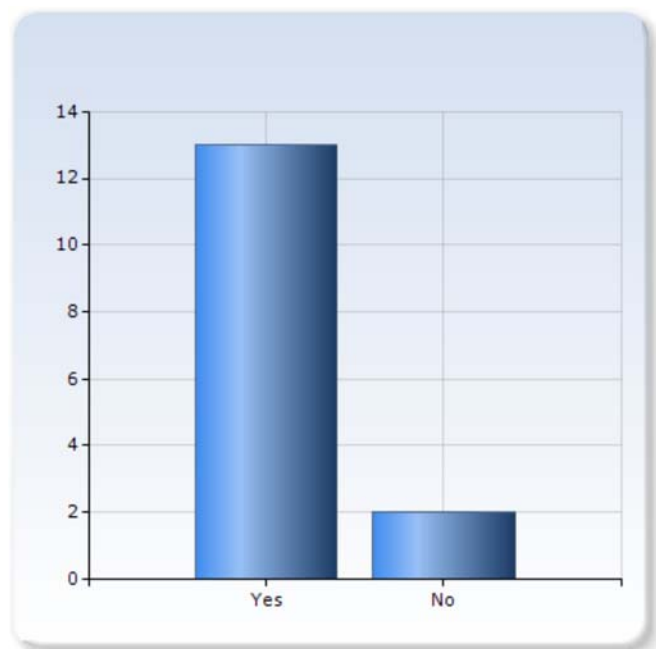
2. Approximately, how many hours per week did you spend studying during this course? (including lectures and seminars/exercises)

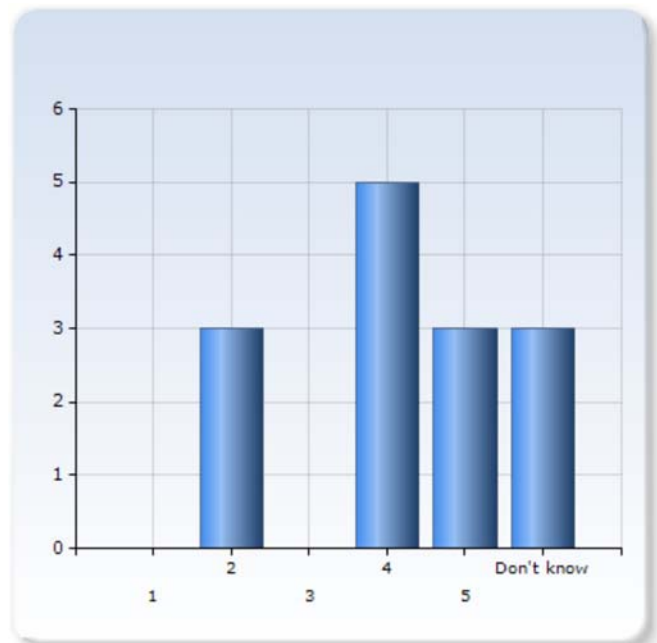

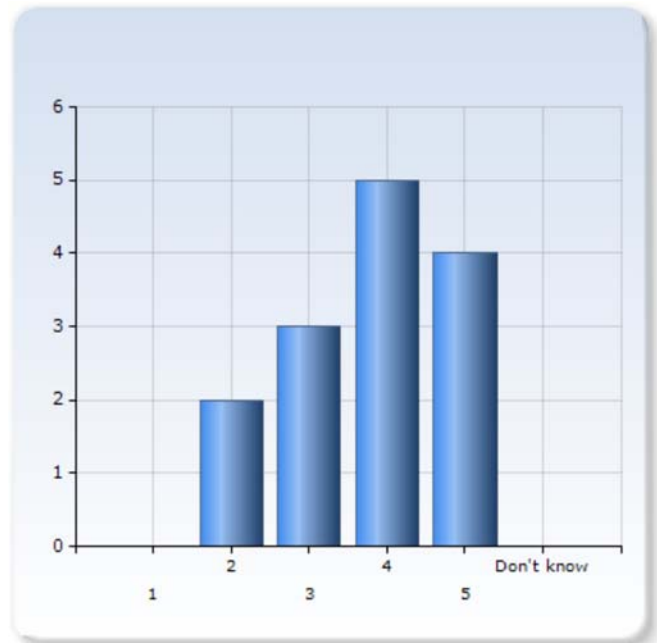

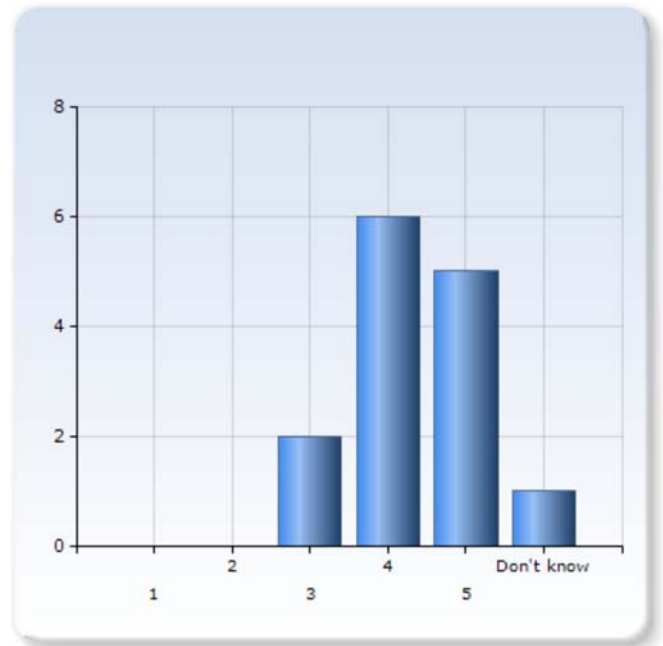
